<p><b>Objective:</b> We will build our social emotional health by understanding how to give and show respect effectively by reading a scenario and relating it to our personal experiences.</p> <p><b>TEKS:</b> 7A: Analyze positive and negative relationships that influence individual and community health such as families, peers, and role models. 8A: Explain the role of media and technology in influencing individuals and community health such as watching television or reading a newspaper. 11C: Describe strategies to show respect for individual differences.</p>	
<p><b>Activities:</b> <b>Warm up:</b> Have you ever watched a tv show where the audience laughed at something that you didn't find funny?</p> <p>You receive media messages every day. These messages are on TV, the Internet, the radio, and in newspapers and magazines. With so many messages, it is important to know how to evaluate them. Evaluating media messages means being able to judge the accuracy of the message. Read and think about the scenario below.</p> <p>Elisa and her brother Brett love watching the TV show <i>Happy Family</i>. The two teenage characters on the show get into trouble a lot, and their parents are always yelling at them. Elisa and Brett think it is funny when this happens. The best part of the show is when the teens talk their parents out of punishments. Despite all the trouble the teens cause, the show always ends with everyone being happy and laughing. Elisa and Brett wish that their family was like the family on the show.</p> <p><b>Lesson Activities:</b> After reading the scenario about Elisa and Brett answer the following questions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. What audience is <i>Happy Family</i> trying to appeal to?</li><li>2. What values are projected by the behaviors of the characters on <i>Happy Family</i>?</li><li>3. How realistic are the interactions between the characters on <i>Happy Family</i>?</li><li>4. Think about a TV show you like to watch. How do the characters on the show behave toward each other? Is their behavior like the behavior of people around you? Explain.</li></ol>
